

1. NCCU has started a season 0-2 for the first time since the 2008-09 season.
2. Assistant coach Eric Wilson was a four-year player at Western Carolina with 56 starts and 454 career points.
3. Three games is the second-longest road swing to begin a season, behind NCCU's six game trip in the 2008-09 season.
4. NCCU's non-conference schedule puts the Eagles on the road nine times out of 14 games.
5. NCCU went 5-9 in non-conference play last year.

SCOUTING THE CATAMOUNTS:

Western Carolina rebounded after a season-opening loss to Miami with a home win against Hiwassee 87-47. Devin Peterson scored a game-high 19 points and Haboubacar Mutombo pulled down a double-double of 10 points and 11 rebounds.

ABOUT THE 2015-16 SEASON

-NCCU went 8-5 at McDougald-McLendon Arena, securing its seventh consecutive winning season at home.

- Led by returner Rashaun Madison, NCCU topped the MEAC in three-point percentage with 34.8 percent of attempts made.

-NCCU once again was one of the best defensive teams in the league, allowing just 69.8 points per game, good for second in the conference.

THE NEW NEST

McDougald-McLendon Arena received some renovations during the offseason before the 2015-16 season, and now boasts the most biomechanically-sophisticated maple sports floor system in the state of North Carolina. The facility also received high-efficiency LED lights from Cree, Inc. as part of a UNC system-wide project, and has a center-hung Daktronics videoboard. NATION'S SECOND-LONGEST HOME WIN STREAK

NCCU held a 38-game home win streak, which ranked second in Division I behind Arizona. The Eagles had not lost at home since Dec. 4, 2012 (Eastern Kentucky, 57-63). The last MEAC team to beat NCCU in Durham was Savannah State on Feb. 11, 2012 (67-57) before Howard ended the streak on Dec. 7, 2015 (71-69). NCCU defeated 26 consecutive conference opponents during the run.

WE MUST PROTECT THE NEST

During the 2013-14 season, North Carolina Central University went unbeaten at home going 14-0, marking that feat for the first time since the 1997-98 campaign. The Eagles have now gone undefeated at home in consecutive seasons for the first time in school history.

During the 2014-15 season, NCCU earned a third consecutive 20-win season, something that has not happened for the Eagles since 1990 under the direction of head coach Michael Bernard. John B. McLendon was the only other coach to lead the Eagles to three straight 20-win seasons from 1948-51. Here's a look at all 18 of NCCU's 20-win seasons.

Va. – North Carolina Central University guard Dajuan Graf (Charlotte, N.C.) didn't show any signs of rust as he poured in a team-high 19 points on 8-for-13 from the field, however the Eagles dropped their season-opener 81-69 against Marshall University at the Cam Henderson Center on Saturday, Nov. 12.

Graf was also the leading facilitator for NCCU (0-1) as he dished out six assists and also nabbed two steals. The Eagles hung tight with Marshall (1-0) through the first half as neither team led by more than six points in the first 20 minutes, and the Eagles went to the half down by three, 35-32. Patrick Cole (Newark, N.J.) did most of his damage in the first period, as he compiled 13 of his 18 total points, and he also finished with eight rebounds.

In the second half, Marshall was able to string together a few scoring runs to open up a double-digit lead, and get their first win of the year. A handful of Eagles made their maroon and gray debut, including a double-double from senior guard Ron Trapps (Lancaster, S.C.) with 11 points and 10 rebounds, and Del'Vin Dickerson (Houston, Texas) also collected 11 points.

The Thundering Herd were led by Terrence Thompson (Durham, N.C.) who had a game-high 20 points on his way to a double-double with 10 boards, and he was followed by Jon Elmore (Charleston, W. Va.) who had 17 points as four of the Marshall starters registered double-digit point totals.

Cole and Eagles Held Off by Ohio State

COLUMBUS, Ohio – North Carolina Central University senior guard Patrick Cole (Newark, N.J.) stole the show on national television as he torched the net for a game-high 26 points, but Ohio State held the Eagles at bay for a 69-63 final on Monday, Nov. 14 at the Value City Arena.

The first half contained a few runs as OSU (2-0) rattled off a 12-point run after a slow start to pull ahead by 10, but then NCCU (0-2) responded with a 7-0 run of their own. The Eagles went on to hold a brief lead in the final four minutes of the half. However, a late three from JaQuan Lyle (Evansville, Ind.) put the Buckeyes ahead 31-29 at the break.

Cole was a sparkplug for the Eagles in the first 20 minutes as he picked up 10 points and filled the stat sheet over the course of the game with a total of six helpers and six boards. Dajuan Graf (Charlotte, N.C.) was also a big contributor in the first half with eight points.

In the second half, the Buckeyes were able to find their gear and pushed the lead out to as many as 12 points at 61-49 with five minutes to play. The Eagles didn't give in as they played tough defense down the stretch leading to Rashaun Madison (Norfolk, Va.) and Ron Trapps (Lancaster, S.C.) combining to hit back-to-back treys to shrink the lead to six in just 30 seconds.

Another big three from Cole with under a minute to play trimmed the lead to five, but Ohio State was able to see the game through to a 69-63 conclusion. Trapps picked up 12 points off the bench for NCCU along with seven rebounds, and Del'vin Dickerson (Houston, Texas) was a contributor down low with seven points and six boards. Kyle Benton (Long Beach, Calif.) also entered the fray as a reserve and put up five points with seven rebounds, tying Trapps for the team-high.

Jae'Sean Tate (Pickerington, Ohio) motored OSU forward with a double-double of 21 points and 10 rebounds, and Micah Potter (Mentor, Ohio) knocked down three triples for 13 points.

On March 25, 2009, arguably one of the greatest players in school history was elevated from Assistant Coach to the position of Head Coach, becoming the 17th to be named in that spot in the program's history.

Close to 25 years after the magical run of the 1989 NCAA Division II National Championship team, and just 10 days shy of the fifth anniversary of the day of his official hiring, NCCU soared to its first MEAC Tournament Championship on March 15, 2014 following its 71-62 victory over Morgan State in front of a near-capacity crowd inside the Norfolk Scope Arena. The 2013-14 Eagles tied a school record in wins (28), won the most games in a season for any squad in MEAC history, and was the lowest seed for any league champion in the NCAA Tournament as the maroon and gray earned a 14-seed in the East Region. Moton's squad finished 15-1 in conference play earning the school's first Division I regular season title and won 20 straight contests, which set a new NCAA Division I level record for the program.

The following year, his sixth season as head coach at NCCU, Moton guided the 2014-15 Eagles to a 25-8 overall record, including a 19-3 mark during the final three-and-a-half months, as well as the school's first appearance in the National Invitation Tournament. The 2014-15 squad made history by becoming the first men's basketball team in school history to post an unbeaten regular-season conference record at 16-0 to repeat as MEAC regular-season champions. The Eagles were among the top five defenses in Division I, ranking second in field goal percentage defense (behind Kentucky), fourth in three-point field goal percentage defense and fifth in scoring defense. NCCU completed the campaign by extending the second-longest home win streak in Division I at 35 victories in-a-row (behind Arizona).

Moton joined hall of fame coach John McLendon and national championship coach Michael Bernard as the only coaches in NCCU men's basketball history to lead the Eagles to three straight 20-win seasons. As a credit to the program's recent success, NCCU boasts the best regular-season conference record during the last three seasons at 46-2, a winning percentage of .958.

With the rings of a champion came the accolades as Moton earned MEAC Coach of the Year honors, MEAC Tournament's Most Outstanding Coach award, and was named the BoxtoRow.com HBCU National Coach of the Year, while earning finalist spots in the Hugh Durham National Coach of the Year Award (Top-Mid-Major Coach), and the Top Minority Coach honor, the Ben Jobe National Coach of the Year Award.

The maroon and gray's second season in the MEAC, Moton's fourth, was the coming out party for the program. For the first time at the NCAA Division I level, the Eagles won 20 games finishing the year 22-9, and went 15-1 in conference play to earn the No. 2 seed in the conference tournament. Moton earned national praise by being named a finalist for the Ben Jobe National Coach of the Year Award, and the Hugh Durham National Coach of the Year Award, along with Co-Coach of the Year in the MEAC by CollegeInsider.com.

In his third season in charge of NCCU, Moton took his team to a place not since seen since the 2004-05 season when the Eagles finished with a winning record (17-15) and were seeded fifth in their first MEAC Tournament at the Division I level.

His second year at the helm his squad showed the Eagle Nation how bright the future was as his squad racked up 15 wins and recorded the first non-losing season in nearly six years. He earned NCAA Division I Independent Coach of the Year honors.

He initially returned to his alma mater as assistant men's basketball coach in July 2007.

The Hall-of-Famer joined the NCCU staff after serving as head boys basketball coach at Sanderson High School in his hometown of Raleigh, N.C. During his three-year tenure (2004-07) at Sanderson, Moton led the Spartans to an overall record of 59-25, while winning back-to-back Cap-7 tournament championships in 2006 and 2007.

A 1996 graduate of NCCU with a bachelor's degree in recreation administration, Moton became the school's third all-time leading scorer with 1,714 points during his historic hardwood career as an Eagle from 1992-96, earning the nickname "Poetry 'n Moton."

During his junior and senior seasons, Moton was voted All-CIAA First Team, NCAA Division II

South Atlantic All-Region First Team and NCAA Division II All-America Honorable Mention. He was named the 1996 CIAA (Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association) Men's Basketball Player of the Year and was inducted into the NCCU Athletic Hall of Fame in 2004.

Among NCCU's all-time career leaders, Moton ranks first in 3-point field goals made (213 of 529), third in scoring (1,714 points), fourth in free throws made (363 of 467), fifth in assists (278), eighth in field goals made (569 of 1,159), 10th in scoring average (16.6 points per game), and 11th in steals (110).

As a junior (1994-95), he topped the CIAA and was No. 16 in NCAA Division II in scoring with an average of 23.5 points per game. His 87 made three-point field goals that year remains the school's single-season record.

As a senior (1995-96), he placed second in the CIAA with 21.3 points per game and ranked among the conference's top 10 statistical leaders in assists, free throw percentage and 3-point field goal percentage.

Moton played on three CIAA Southern Division Championship teams and made two trips to the NCAA playoffs, including an NCAA Division II South Atlantic Regional Championship title in 1993.

After NCCU, Moton played four years of professional basketball in Indonesia (1996-97) and Israel (1998-99). Throughout his professional playing career, Moton averaged 25.0 points per contest, and dished out a little more than five assists per game as a pro.

He was head coach at West Millbrook Middle School for three seasons (2001-04) before taking over the Sanderson boys basketball program in 2004.

Moton is a 1992 graduate of Enloe High School in Raleigh, N.C., where he was named Cap5 Player of the Year as a senior.

In December of 2013, Moton received his Master's degree in Special Education with a focus on Learning Disabilities.

He and his wife, Bridget, married on June 28, 2008. They have two children Brooke and LeVelle Jr.
