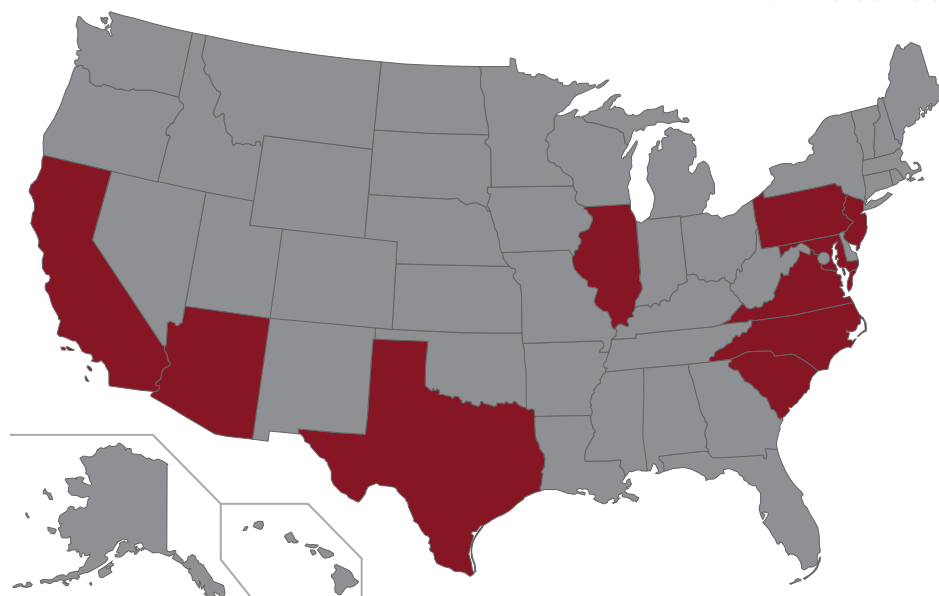

STARTING FIVE:

1. NCCU is 9-1 in the Division I era in home openers, and has won eight straight.
2. NCCU leads the MEAC in field goal percentage at 48.6.
3. NCCU will be on the road for six of the next 10 games.
4. NCCU's non-conference schedule puts the Eagles on the road nine times out of 14 games.
5. NCCU went 5-9 in non-conference play last year.

SCOUTING THE NORSE:

Northern Kentucky is currently on a two-game win streak after victories over Delaware and Miami (OH) in the Tarkett Sports Classic. Drew McDonald leads the Norse in scoring with 18.8 points per game with 8.0 rebounds, followed by Jeff Garrett with 10.8 points and 8.8 boards per game.

SCOUTING THE TIGERS:

Missouri is led by Kevin Puryear, the Tigers' leading scorer in 2015-16 and current leading rebounder this season with 6.8 boards per outing. Frankie Hughes leads in scoring with 15.8 points per game. The Tigers are fresh off of a 67-62 win over Tulane in the Tire Pros Invitational, bolstered by K.J. Walton's 20 points.

NCCU vs HORIZON

The Horizon League features 10 member institutions, and NCCU has only faced one. The Eagles visited Youngstown State on Jan. 27, 2010 and fell 70-57.

NCCU vs SEC

The Southeastern Conference is a two-division league with 14 institutions, and NCCU has visited three. The Eagles have taken on Florida, Mississippi State, and South Carolina, and have fallen in each matchup. During the 2015-16 season NCCU will travel to Missouri and Louisiana State.

NICE TO MEET YOU

NCCU plays Northern Kentucky and Missouri for the first time in program history, joining Ohio State on the list of first time opponents in the 2016-17 season. The Eagles will later face Louisiana State, McNeese State and Truett-McConnell for the first time in program history.

TRIPLE, DOUBLE

Parick Cole made history when he recorded the first triple-double in the Division-I era for NCCU with 14 points, 12 rebounds and 10 assists against Jackson State. Dajuan Graf picked up a double-double in the same game with 15 points and 11 assists, making both players the first with double-digit assists since the 2014-15 season.

100%

Junior forward Pablo Rivas matched a rare feat of former Eagle Dominique Sutton against Western Carolina on Nov. 16, as he went 7-for-7 from the floor and 2-for-2 from the free throw line for 18 points and nine rebounds. He is the only other Eagle besides Emmanuel Chapman to shoot 100% from the floor with a spotless three-point percentage as well.

STEALING THE SHOW

Redshirt senior guard Patrick Cole showcased his skills on national television as he poured in 26 points for the Eagles against Ohio State on ESPNU on Monday, Nov. 14. Cole knocked down three treys and also contributed six rebounds and six assists.

ALLOW ME TO INTRODUCE MYSELF...

Newcomer senior guard Ron Trapps has made a strong impression in his first two games, averaging 11.5 points and 8.5 rebounds for the maroon and gray. He collected a double-double in his first appearance against Marshall on Nov. 12 with 11 points and 10 boards off the bench.

ABOUT THE 2015-16 SEASON

-NCCU went 8-5 at McDougald-McLendon Arena, securing its seventh consecutive winning season at home.

- Led by returner Rashaun Madison, NCCU topped the MEAC in three-point percentage with 34.8 percent of attempts made.

-NCCU once again was one of the best defensive teams in the league, allowing just 69.8 points per game, good for second in the conference.

THE NEW NEST

McDougald-McLendon Arena received some renovations during the offseason before the 2015-16 season, and now boasts the most biomechanically-sophisticated maple sports floor system in the state of North Carolina. The facility also received high-efficiency LED lights from Cree, Inc. as part of a UNC system-wide project, and has a center-hung Daktronics videoboard. NATION'S SECOND-LONGEST HOME WIN STREAK

NCCU held a 38-game home win streak, which ranked second in Division I behind Arizona. The Eagles had not lost at home since Dec. 4, 2012 (Eastern Kentucky, 57-63). The last MEAC team to beat NCCU in Durham was Savannah State on Feb. 11, 2012 (67-57) before Howard ended the streak on Dec. 7, 2015 (71-69). NCCU defeated 26 consecutive conference opponents during the run.

WE MUST PROTECT THE NEST

During the 2013-14 season, North Carolina Central University went unbeaten at home going 14-0, marking that feat for the first time since the 1997-98 campaign. The Eagles have now gone undefeated at home in consecutive seasons for the first time in school history.

Rivas Headlines Eagles' Win Over Western Carolina

CULLOWHEE, N.C. – North Carolina Central University junior forward Pablo Rivas (Phoenix, Ariz.) did something that no Eagle since Dominique Sutton has done as NCCU took down Western Carolina 67-59 at the Ramsey Center on Wednesday, Nov. 16.

Rivas was a perfect 7-for-7 from the floor, 2-for-2 from the arc and 2-for-2 at the free throw line for a total of 18 points and nine rebounds, tying the mark set by Sutton against Johnson & Wales in 2011 for the most points and rebounds in a spotless shooting performance.

Just like the first two games of the road trip for NCCU (1-2), the first half was tightly contested as the Eagles went to the half level with WCU (1-2) at 28 points apiece. NCCU led by as many as nine in the first half, with Rivas coming off the bench to chip in nine points.

Kyle Benton (Long Beach, Calif.) also was a presence in the post with seven points and three rebounds on his way to 11 points and eight caroms, backed up by four boards and six points from Patrick Cole (Newark, N.J.) in the first period.

The second half followed the same trend as the first at the start, until the Eagles gained some momentum to pull away late as Rivas came alive down the stretch with another nine points to help push the Eagles to the finish line. Cole was also a big factor after the intermission moving to a total of 20 points and Dajuan Graf (Charlotte, N.C.) dished out four assists with 12 points and two steals.

WCU had four double-digit scorers of their own as Marc Gosselin led with 13 points and seven rebounds, and Deriece Parks contributed 12 points and four boards.

Cole Leads Eagles Over Jackson State with Triple-Double

DURHAM, N.C. – North Carolina Central University redshirt senior guard Patrick Cole (Newark, N.J.) accomplished a feat that no Eagle has done in the Division-I era as he posted a triple-double with 14 points, 12 rebounds and 10 assists in a 84-75 win over Jackson State University on Friday, Nov. 18 inside McDougald-McLendon Arena.

Cole was backed up by senior guard Dajuan Graf (Charlotte, N.C.) who collected his first career double-double at NCCU (2-2) with 15 points and 11 assists, making him and Cole the first Eagles to record double-digit assists in a single game since the 2014-15 season.

Not to be outdone, Rashaun Madison (Norfolk, Va.) splashed eight three-pointers in 10 attempts for a career-high and game-high 24 points, and tied the mark for the third-most treys made in a contest with Anthony McDonald (Dec. 2, 2014 vs. Johnson & Wales) and men's basketball head coach LeVelle Moton (Feb. 18, 1995, vs. Virginia Union).

NCCU led wire-to-wire over JSU (1-2) and led by as many as 13 in the first half. The Eagles shot nearly 60 percent from the floor (28-47), over 50 percent from the arc (10-18) and about 67 percent from the free throw line (18-27). The Eagles also assisted 23 times on 28 made field goals.

Will Ransom (Fort Worth, Texas) chipped in 11 points as a starter, and Pablo Rivas (Phoenix, Ariz.) contributed in a big way from the bench with 15 points over 29 minutes.

On March 25, 2009, arguably one of the greatest players in school history was elevated from Assistant Coach to the position of Head Coach, becoming the 17th to be named in that spot in the program's history.

Close to 25 years after the magical run of the 1989 NCAA Division II National Championship team, and just 10 days shy of the fifth anniversary of the day of his official hiring, NCCU soared to its first MEAC Tournament Championship on March 15, 2014 following its 71-62 victory over Morgan State in front of a near-capacity crowd inside the Norfolk Scope Arena. The 2013-14 Eagles tied a school record in wins (28), won the most games in a season for any squad in MEAC history, and was the lowest seed for any league champion in the NCAA Tournament as the maroon and gray earned a 14-seed in the East Region. Moton's squad finished 15-1 in conference play earning the school's first Division I regular season title and won 20 straight contests, which set a new NCAA Division I level record for the program.

The following year, his sixth season as head coach at NCCU, Moton guided the 2014-15 Eagles to a 25-8 overall record, including a 19-3 mark during the final three-and-a-half months, as well as the school's first appearance in the National Invitation Tournament. The 2014-15 squad made history by becoming the first men's basketball team in school history to post an unbeaten regular-season conference record at 16-0 to repeat as MEAC regular-season champions. The Eagles were among the top five defenses in Division I, ranking second in field goal percentage defense (behind Kentucky), fourth in three-point field goal percentage defense and fifth in scoring defense. NCCU completed the campaign by extending the second-longest home win streak in Division I at 35 victories in-a-row (behind Arizona).

Moton joined hall of fame coach John McLendon and national championship coach Michael Bernard as the only coaches in NCCU men's basketball history to lead the Eagles to three straight 20-win seasons. As a credit to the program's recent success, NCCU boasts the best regular-season conference record during the last three seasons at 46-2, a winning percentage of .958.

With the rings of a champion came the accolades as Moton earned MEAC Coach of the Year honors, MEAC Tournament's Most Outstanding Coach award, and was named the BoxtoRow.com HBCU National Coach of the Year, while earning finalist spots in the Hugh Durham National Coach of the Year Award (Top-Mid-Major Coach), and the Top Minority Coach honor, the Ben Jobe National Coach of the Year Award.

The maroon and gray's second season in the MEAC, Moton's fourth, was the coming out party for the program. For the first time at the NCAA Division I level, the Eagles won 20 games finishing the year 22-9, and went 15-1 in conference play to earn the No. 2 seed in the conference tournament. Moton earned national praise by being named a finalist for the Ben Jobe National Coach of the Year Award, and the Hugh Durham National Coach of the Year Award, along with Co-Coach of the Year in the MEAC by CollegeInsider.com.

In his third season in charge of NCCU, Moton took his team to a place not since seen since the 2004-05 season when the Eagles finished with a winning record (17-15) and were seeded fifth in their first MEAC Tournament at the Division I level.

His second year at the helm his squad showed the Eagle Nation how bright the future was as his squad racked up 15 wins and recorded the first non-losing season in nearly six years. He earned NCAA Division I Independent Coach of the Year honors.

He initially returned to his alma mater as assistant men's basketball coach in July 2007.

The Hall-of-Famer joined the NCCU staff after serving as head boys basketball coach at Sanderson High School in his hometown of Raleigh, N.C. During his three-year tenure (2004-07) at Sanderson, Moton led the Spartans to an overall record of 59-25, while winning back-to-back Cap-7 tournament championships in 2006 and 2007.

A 1996 graduate of NCCU with a bachelor's degree in recreation administration, Moton became the school's third all-time leading scorer with 1,714 points during his historic hardwood career as an Eagle from 1992-96, earning the nickname "Poetry 'n Moton."

During his junior and senior seasons, Moton was voted All-CIAA First Team, NCAA Division II

South Atlantic All-Region First Team and NCAA Division II All-America Honorable Mention. He was named the 1996 CIAA (Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association) Men's Basketball Player of the Year and was inducted into the NCCU Athletic Hall of Fame in 2004.

Among NCCU's all-time career leaders, Moton ranks first in 3-point field goals made (213 of 529), third in scoring (1,714 points), fourth in free throws made (363 of 467), fifth in assists (278), eighth in field goals made (569 of 1,159), 10th in scoring average (16.6 points per game), and 11th in steals (110).

As a junior (1994-95), he topped the CIAA and was No. 16 in NCAA Division II in scoring with an average of 23.5 points per game. His 87 made three-point field goals that year remains the school's single-season record.

As a senior (1995-96), he placed second in the CIAA with 21.3 points per game and ranked among the conference's top 10 statistical leaders in assists, free throw percentage and 3-point field goal percentage.

Moton played on three CIAA Southern Division Championship teams and made two trips to the NCAA playoffs, including an NCAA Division II South Atlantic Regional Championship title in 1993.

After NCCU, Moton played four years of professional basketball in Indonesia (1996-97) and Israel (1998-99). Throughout his professional playing career, Moton averaged 25.0 points per contest, and dished out a little more than five assists per game as a pro.

He was head coach at West Millbrook Middle School for three seasons (2001-04) before taking over the Sanderson boys basketball program in 2004.

Moton is a 1992 graduate of Enloe High School in Raleigh, N.C., where he was named Cap5 Player of the Year as a senior.

In December of 2013, Moton received his Master's degree in Special Education with a focus on Learning Disabilities.

He and his wife, Bridget, married on June 28, 2008. They have two children Brooke and LeVelle Jr.
