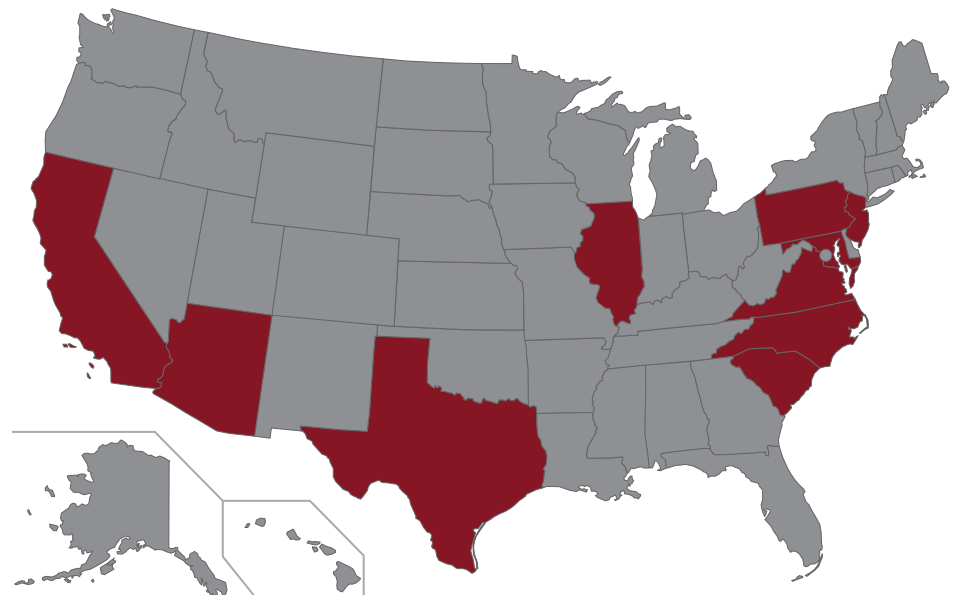

STARTING FIVE:

1. 4-2 is NCCU's best November since the Eagles went 5-1 during the 2013-14 season.
2. NCCU's five-game win streak that was snapped by ECU was the longest since the 2014-15 season with a 10-game and nine-game run.
3. NCCU will be on the road for six of the next 10 games from Nov. 26 to Dec. 30.
4. NCCU's non-conference schedule puts the Eagles on the road nine times out of 14 games.
5. NCCU went 5-9 in non-conference play last year.

SCOUTING THE CHANTICLEERS:

Coastal Carolina enters this contest with a 4-6 record in its first year competing in the Sun Belt Conference. The Eagles meet the Chanticleers for just the second time, and the first matchup since 2011. CCU holds a 2-0 series lead. CCU is led by Preseason Second-Team All-Sun Belt selection Elijah Wilson who is currently averaging 15.1 points and 4.0 rebounds per game. Wilson scored 16 points with six boards in CCU's win over Piedmont International last time out.

NCCU vs SUN BELT

The Sun Belt conference holds 12 institutions, however NCCU has only faced two. The Eagles are 1-2 all-time against the conference, with the lone win coming against Appalachian State at McDougald-McLendon Arena, 76-70 in overtime on Nov. 22, 2013. GOING BACK-TO-BACK

Patrick Cole became the first two-time and back-to-back recipient of the MEAC Player of the Week honor from both the conference and College Sports Madness in the 2016-17 season on Monday, Nov. 28 after a strong four-game stretch from Nov. 14 to Nov. 26 with 23.0 points, 8.0 rebounds and 6.8 assists per game.

NCCU VOTED FOURTH IN MEAC PRESEASON POLL, COLE SECOND TEAM

North Carolina Central University was voted fourth in the preseason poll by the league coaches and sports information directors. NCCU received 234 total points in the poll, and Patrick Cole (Newark, N.J.) was voted to the Second Team.

WELCOME HOME

Senior guard Ron Trapps spent three years playing as a Chanticleer, and now he returns as an Eagle to take on his former team. Trapps appeared in 49 games over his career at CCU.

BLOCK PARTY

The Eagles protected the paint on the road at Missouri as NCCU recorded eight blocks, tied for the seventh-most in a game in the Division-I era. Will Ransom swatted four by himself, which is tied for the third-most in a game in the same time frame.

TRIPLE, DOUBLE

Parick Cole made history when he recorded the first triple-double in the Division-I era for NCCU with 14 points, 12 rebounds and 10 assists against Jackson State. Dajuan Graf picked up a double-double in the same game with 15 points and 11 assists, making both players the first with double-digit assists since the 2014-15 season.

100%

Junior forward Pablo Rivas matched a rare feat of former Eagle Dominique Sutton against Western Carolina on Nov. 16, as he went 7-for-7 from the floor and 2-for-2 from the free throw line for 18 points and nine rebounds. He is the only other Eagle besides Emmanuel Chapman to shoot 100% from the floor with a spotless three-point percentage as well. Rivas shot 100% from the floor a second time at Missouri, but missed one free throw for 16 points and six rebounds (6-6 FG, 4-5 FT).

STEALING THE SHOW

Redshirt senior guard Patrick Cole showcased his skills on national television as he poured in 26 points for the Eagles against Ohio State on ESPNU on Monday, Nov. 14. Cole knocked down three treys and also contributed six rebounds and six assists.

ABOUT THE 2015-16 SEASON

-NCCU went 8-5 at McDougald-McLendon Arena, securing its seventh consecutive winning season at home.
 - Led by returner Rashaun Madison, NCCU topped the MEAC in three-point percentage with 34.8 percent of attempts made.
 -NCCU once again was one of the best defensive teams in the league, allowing just 69.8 points per game, good for second in the conference.

THE NEW NEST

McDougald-McLendon Arena received some renovations during the offseason before the 2015-16 season, and now boasts the most biomechanically-sophisticated maple sports floor system in the state of North Carolina. The facility also received high-efficiency LED lights from Cree, Inc. as part of a UNC system-wide project, and has a center-hung Daktronics videoboard. NATION'S SECOND-LONGEST HOME WIN STREAK

NCCU held a 38-game home win streak, which ranked second in Division I behind Arizona. The Eagles had not lost at home since Dec. 4, 2012 (Eastern Kentucky, 57-63). The last MEAC team to beat NCCU in Durham was Savannah State on Feb. 11, 2012 (67-57) before Howard ended the streak on Dec. 7, 2015 (71-69). Eagles' Win Streak Snapped by East Carolina

GREENVILLE, N.C. – North Carolina Central University's five-game win streak was snapped by a hot-shooting East Carolina University team on Thursday, Dec. 3 as the Pirates shot close to 47 percent from the floor on the way to a 69-56 decision at Minges Coliseum.

NCCU (5-3) got off to a cold shooting start in the first half, but that wasn't the case for ECU (7-2) who made over 50 percent of its shots from the floor and made exactly half of its 12 three-point attempts. Kentrell Barkley (Durham, N.C.) knocked down three on his own in the first 20 minutes to help the Pirates to a 36-26 lead at the intermission.

The strong shooting continued into the second half for ECU, as the Pirates went on to shoot close to 47 percent from the field, led by Caleb White (Buckingham, Va.) who put up 20 points, and shot 8-for-15 from the floor and 4-for-6 from downtown.

The Eagles were able to cut the lead to single digits multiple times in the second with help from Patrick Cole (Newark, N.J.) who scored a team-high 16 points with six rebounds and five assists, but ECU was able to hold off the maroon and gray for a 69-56 final score.

Dajuan Graf (Charlotte, N.C.) and Rashaun Madison (Norfolk, Va.) also scored in double figures with 11 points apiece, and Pablo Rivas (Phoenix, Ariz.) chipped in seven points and five boards. Will Ransom (Fort Worth, Texas) once again was a strong defensive presence for NCCU with eight rebounds, two steals and a block.

Eagles Soar Past LIU Brooklyn

DURHAM, N.C. – North Carolina Central University seniors Patrick Cole (Newark, N.J.) and Del'vin Dickerson (Houston, Texas) combined for career-high games as the Eagles picked up a decisive victory over LIU Brooklyn, 79-56 on Tuesday, Dec. 6 at McDougald-McLendon Arena.

Cole served out a career-high 13 assists, which is good for the fifth-most in a single game, and bested his previous mark of 11 that he set against Jackson State during his triple-double. Dickerson picked up a career-high 23 points, and shot 11-for-17 from the field, becoming the third Eagle to score over 20 points in a game.

Cole also had 18 points for his fourth double-double of the season with five rebounds.

NCCU (6-3) was tied twice with LIU (6-3), but the Eagles never conceded the lead and held an advantage for 38 minutes of the 40. The Eagles took a 15-point lead to the break at 39-24, and later expanded the lead to as many as 25 in the late stages at 75-50.

NCCU made over 50 percent of its shots for the fourth time this season, shooting 56.1 percent, and the Eagles held LIU to just 33.3 percent shooting while allowing just one made three-pointer.

Dajuan Graf (Charlotte, N.C.) was the third Eagle to score in double figures with 14 points and three assists, and Pablo Rivas continued his efficient shooting with nine points on 4-for-5 shooting with seven rebounds. Will Ransom (Fort Worth, Texas) protected the paint once again with a game-high three blocks.

LIU was led by Iverson Fleming (North Brunswick, N.J.) who put up a team-high 16 points, and Jerome Frink (Jersey City, N.J.) was close to a double-double with 10 points and eight rebounds.

South Atlantic All-Region First Team and NCAA Division II All-America Honorable Mention. He was named the 1996 CIAA (Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association) Men's Basketball Player of the Year and was inducted into the NCCU Athletic Hall of Fame in 2004.

Among NCCU's all-time career leaders, Moton ranks first in 3-point field goals made (213 of 529), third in scoring (1,714 points), fourth in free throws made (363 of 467), fifth in assists (278), eighth in field goals made (569 of 1,159), 10th in scoring average (16.6 points per game), and 11th in steals (110).

As a junior (1994-95), he topped the CIAA and was No. 16 in NCAA Division II in scoring with an average of 23.5 points per game. His 87 made three-point field goals that year remains the school's single-season record.

As a senior (1995-96), he placed second in the CIAA with 21.3 points per game and ranked among the conference's top 10 statistical leaders in assists, free throw percentage and 3-point field goal percentage.

Moton played on three CIAA Southern Division Championship teams and made two trips to the NCAA playoffs, including an NCAA Division II South Atlantic Regional Championship title in 1993.

After NCCU, Moton played four years of professional basketball in Indonesia (1996-97) and Israel (1998-99). Throughout his professional playing career, Moton averaged 25.0 points per contest, and dished out a little more than five assists per game as a pro.

He was head coach at West Millbrook Middle School for three seasons (2001-04) before taking over the Sanderson boys basketball program in 2004.

Moton is a 1992 graduate of Enloe High School in Raleigh, N.C., where he was named Cap5 Player of the Year as a senior.

In December of 2013, Moton received his Master's degree in Special Education with a focus on Learning Disabilities.

He and his wife, Bridget, married on June 28, 2008. They have two children Brooke and LeVelle Jr.

On March 25, 2009, arguably one of the greatest players in school history was elevated from Assistant Coach to the position of Head Coach, becoming the 17th to be named in that spot in the program's history.

Close to 25 years after the magical run of the 1989 NCAA Division II National Championship team, and just 10 days shy of the fifth anniversary of the day of his official hiring, NCCU soared to its first MEAC Tournament Championship on March 15, 2014 following its 71-62 victory over Morgan State in front of a near-capacity crowd inside the Norfolk Scope Arena. The 2013-14 Eagles tied a school record in wins (28), won the most games in a season for any squad in MEAC history, and was the lowest seed for any league champion in the NCAA Tournament as the maroon and gray earned a 14-seed in the East Region. Moton's squad finished 15-1 in conference play earning the school's first Division I regular season title and won 20 straight contests, which set a new NCAA Division I level record for the program.

The following year, his sixth season as head coach at NCCU, Moton guided the 2014-15 Eagles to a 25-8 overall record, including a 19-3 mark during the final three-and-a-half months, as well as the school's first appearance in the National Invitation Tournament. The 2014-15 squad made history by becoming the first men's basketball team in school history to post an unbeaten regular-season conference record at 16-0 to repeat as MEAC regular-season champions. The Eagles were among the top five defenses in Division I, ranking second in field goal percentage defense (behind Kentucky), fourth in three-point field goal percentage defense and fifth in scoring defense. NCCU completed the campaign by extending the second-longest home win streak in Division I at 35 victories in-a-row (behind Arizona).

Moton joined hall of fame coach John McLendon and national championship coach Michael Bernard as the only coaches in NCCU men's basketball history to lead the Eagles to three straight 20-win seasons. As a credit to the program's recent success, NCCU boasts the best regular-season conference record during the last three seasons at 46-2, a winning percentage of .958.

With the rings of a champion came the accolades as Moton earned MEAC Coach of the Year honors, MEAC Tournament's Most Outstanding Coach award, and was named the BoxtoRow.com HBCU National Coach of the Year, while earning finalist spots in the Hugh Durham National Coach of the Year Award (Top-Mid-Major Coach), and the Top Minority Coach honor, the Ben Jobe National Coach of the Year Award.

The maroon and gray's second season in the MEAC, Moton's fourth, was the coming out party for the program. For the first time at the NCAA Division I level, the Eagles won 20 games finishing the year 22-9, and went 15-1 in conference play to earn the No. 2 seed in the conference tournament. Moton earned national praise by being named a finalist for the Ben Jobe National Coach of the Year Award, and the Hugh Durham National Coach of the Year of Award, along with Co-Coach of the Year in the MEAC by CollegeInsider.com.

In his third season in charge of NCCU, Moton took his team to a place not since seen since the 2004-05 season when the Eagles finished with a winning record (17-15) and were seeded fifth in their first MEAC Tournament at the Division I level.

His second year at the helm his squad showed the Eagle Nation how bright the future was as his squad racked up 15 wins and recorded the first non-losing season in nearly six years. He earned NCAA Division I Independent Coach of the Year honors.

He initially returned to his alma mater as assistant men's basketball coach in July 2007.

The Hall-of-Famer joined the NCCU staff after serving as head boys basketball coach at Sanderson High School in his hometown of Raleigh, N.C. During his three-year tenure (2004-07) at Sanderson, Moton led the Spartans to an overall record of 59-25, while winning back-to-back Cap-7 tournament championships in 2006 and 2007.

A 1996 graduate of NCCU with a bachelor's degree in recreation administration, Moton became the school's third all-time leading scorer with 1,714 points during his historic hardwood career as an Eagle from 1992-96, earning the nickname "Poetry 'n Moton."

During his junior and senior seasons, Moton was voted All-CIAA First Team, NCAA Division II

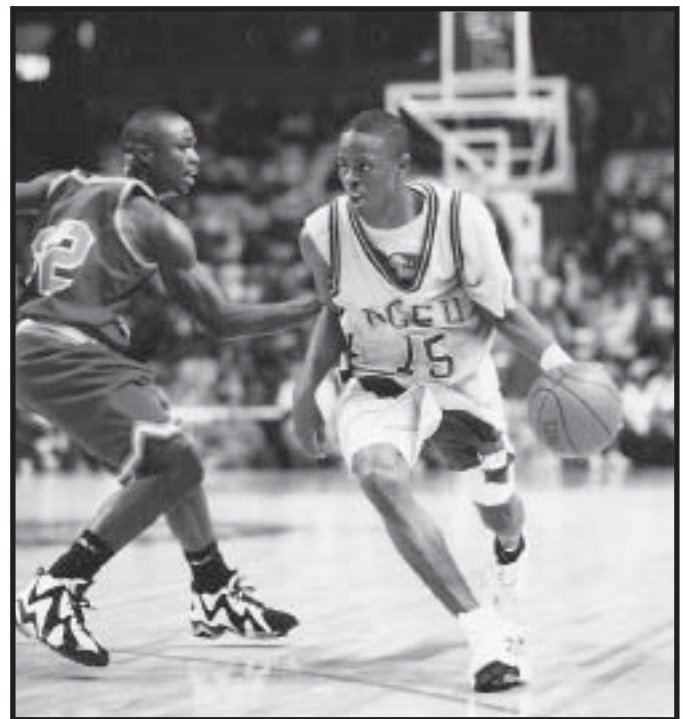
