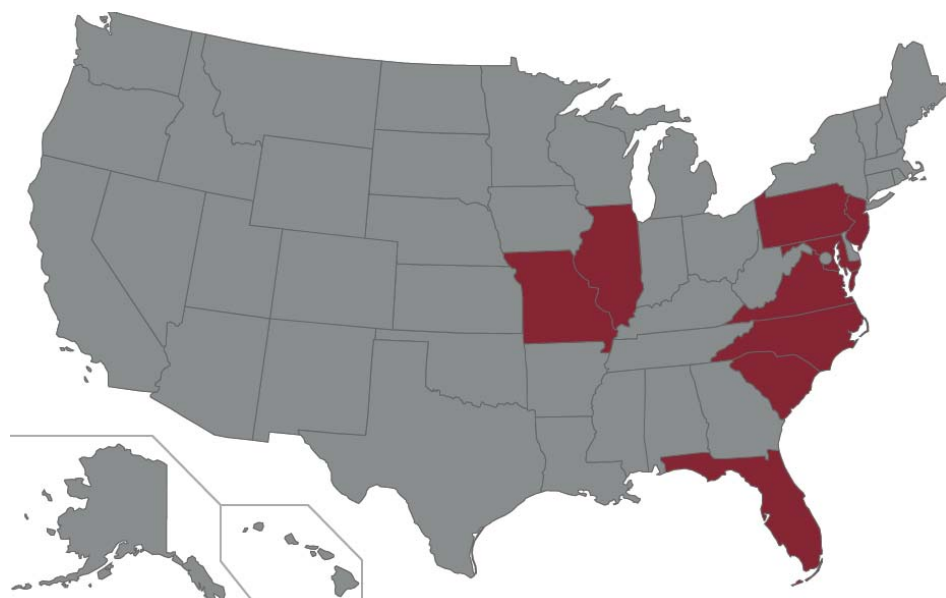

STARTING FIVE:

1. This is NCCU's first meeting with SEMO since the 1989 Division-II National Championship, where the Eagles won 73-46.
2. NCCU was 11-6 in road games during the 2016-17 season.
3. NCCU will play nine games in November, the most since the 2012-13 season where the Eagles played eight.
4. NCCU's non-conference schedule puts the Eagles on the road nine times out of 14 games.
5. NCCU went 9-5 in non-conference play last year.

SCOUTING THE REDHAWKS:

Southeast Missouri State returns stateside after playing two games to finish the Cancun Challenge, going 1-3 in the event. The Redhawks are currently led by Denzel Mahoney who is averaging 18.8 points and 5.2 rebounds per game. Mahoney contributed a team-high 27 points with six rebounds in the last game against Montana State, where SEMO was defeated 82-88.

FULL PLATE

NCCU will play three-games in five days during this Thanksgiving trip, with all three being played in separate states. Since the 2013-14 season, the Eagles are 4-7 in games played during the week of Thanksgiving.

SLIPPERY ROCK

The Eagles were bitten by the turnover bug as they lost the rock 26 times at Evansville, the most since Jan. 15, 2010 during the Division I transition when the Eagles turned the ball over 27 times against Tennessee Temple.

NEXT MAN UP

NCCU is one of less than 10 schools that returns zero starters from its previous season. The Eagles bring back the second-fewest starts in the nation with 11, all coming from C.J. Wiggins, and the third-fewest total minutes with 862, 626 of which came from Pablo Rivas.

DOUBLE BY THREE

NCCU opened the 2017-18 season with consecutive games with three players recording double-figures. Raasean Davis and Reginald Gardner, Jr. have both scored 10+ points twice, and Zacarry Douglas and Brandon Goldsmith have cleared the plateau once.

NCCU vs OHIO VALLEY CONFERENCE

This is the second time the Eagles will play a team from the Ohio Valley Conference, after falling to Tennessee-Martin earlier this season. The Eagles have taken on eight of the current members of the OVC. With NCCU 5-16 all-time against the teams in the league. NCCU beat Southeast Missouri State 73-46 on March 25, 1989 to win the NCAA Division II National Championship. In NCCU's first season during the transition to the NCAA Division I level, the Eagles beat Tennessee Tech on Nov. 21, 2007 in Durham, N.C. (73-70) to earn the first Division I win for the Eagles. The Eagles last met an OVC team in Las Vegas during the Global Sports Classic in 2015, and NCCU beat Eastern Illinois 57-52.

Larry McKnight, Jr. was highly efficient from the floor at Marshall as he was 7-for-7 from the field, 3-3 from the arc and 2-2 from the free throw line for 19 points. Last season, senior forward Pablo Rivas matched a rare feat of former Eagle Dominique Sutton against Western Carolina on Nov. 16, as he went 7-for-7 from the floor and 2-for-2 from the free throw line for 18 points and nine rebounds. McKnight and Rivas are in rare company now, joining Emmanuel Chapman as the only other Eagles to shoot 100 percent from the floor with a spotless three-point percentage as well. Rivas shot 100 percent from the floor a second time at Missouri, but missed one free throw for 16 points and six rebounds (6-6 FG, 4-5 FT)

ABOUT THE 2016-17 SEASON

-Patrick Cole became the third Eagle to be named conference Player of the Year by putting up 19.6 points, 6.9 rebounds and 5.7 assists per game.

-NCCU went 11-2 at McDougald-McLendon Arena, securing its eighth consecutive winning season at home.

- The Eagles captured their third MEAC Regular Season title and made their second NCAA Tournament appearance after going 13-3 in league play.

-NCCU once again was one of the best defensive teams in the league, allowing just 63.5 points per game to lead the league, and was 11th in the nation in field goal percentage allowed at 39.3 percent.

THE NEW NEST

McDougald-McLendon Arena received some renovations during the offseason before the 2015-16 season, and now boasts the most biomechanically-sophisticated maple sports floor system in the state of North Carolina. The facility also received high-efficiency LED lights from Cree, Inc. as part of a UNC system-wide project, and has a center-hung Daktronics videoboard. NATION'S SECOND-LONGEST HOME WIN STREAK

NCCU held a 38-game home win streak, which ranked second in Division I behind Arizona. The Eagles had not lost at home since Dec. 4, 2012 [Eastern Kentucky, 57-63]. The last MEAC team to beat NCCU in Durham was Savannah State on Feb. 11, 2012 [67-57] before Howard ended the streak on Dec. 7, 2015 [71-69]. NCCU defeated 26 consecutive conference opponents during the run.

WE MUST PROTECT THE NEST

During the 2013-14 season, North Carolina Central University went unbeaten at home going 14-0, marking that feat for the first time since the 1997-98 campaign. The Eagles have now gone undefeated at home in consecutive seasons for the first time in school history.

Eagles Held off by Marshall

HUNTINGTON, W. Va. – North Carolina Central University staged a late run to pull within single-digits with under three minutes remaining, but Marshall was able to hold off the resurgent Eagles for a 92-84 final score at the Cam Henderson Center on Wednesday, Nov. 22.

NCCU (2-4) got off to a hot start as Reggie Gardner, Jr. (Bowie, Md.) nailed a quick barrage of threes to give the Eagles a 9-7 lead over Marshall (3-2) in the early stages. Marshall went on a run of its own to flip the tables, but the Eagles held tight and went to the half down nine, 47-38.

The Thundering Herd opened up a 17-point lead in the second half, but the Eagles were unfazed and clawed their way back, and trimmed the lead to single-digits with under three minutes to go.

It took some timely threes from Gardner, and Zacarry Douglas (Landover, Md.) for the Eagles to make their way back into the game, but the Thundering Herd were able to keep the Eagles at bay for a 92-84 final.

Raasean Davis (Chicago, Ill.) was again a driving force for the Eagles with a career-high 21 points and five rebounds, and Gardner also had a career-high with 17 points as he splashed five treys in the contest. Douglas also hit a career-high with 15 points, along with Larry McKnight, Jr. (North Miami, Fla.) who matched him with 15 points and a career-high five rebounds.

Marshall was led by Ajdin Penava (Sarajevo, Bosnia & Herzegovina) who put 23 points with five rebounds, and Jon Elmore (Charleston, W. Va.) scored a game-high 24 points with four three-pointers, and dished out a game-high nine assists.

NCCU shot 53.2 percent from the floor and 46.2 percent from the perimeter as a team, and Marshall shot 54.1 percent from the floor in a highly-accurate contest.

Eagles Outrun in Second Half by Illinois

CHAMPAIGN, Ill. – North Carolina Central University held a one-point lead at the half, but Illinois mounted a second-half run to come away for an 86-73 win on Friday, Nov. 24 at the State Farm Center.

NCCU (2-6) again took an early lead with three-pointers from Reggie Gardner, Jr. (Bowie, Md.) and Zacarry Douglas (Landover, Md.) and led 6-2, but Illinois (6-0) worked its way back to tie and eventually went on a 14-0 run to put a damper on the Eagles early.

Once again, just like the game at Marshall, the Eagles were not rattled. The maroon and gray held firm and eventually rattled off an 8-0 run to draw within four in the mid-stages of the half, capped by a transition jumper from the free throw line by C.J. Wiggins (Richmond, Va.). The Illini held a slim lead, but the Eagles eventually snatched it from them as Gardner nailed a corner trey with three seconds remaining in the half to give the Eagles a 35-34 advantage at the break.

Illinois flipped the script in the second half, and went on a run to expand the lead on a volley of threes from Michael Finke (Champaign, Ill.) and the Illini held the Eagles at bay for the remainder of the contest.

Pablo Rivas (Colon, Panama) pulled down his first double-double of the year for NCCU with 11 points and 10 boards, and Gardner dropped in a team-high 18 points on five made triples. Douglas contributed 11 points with 8 rebounds as well.

The Eagles as a team shot 60 percent from the perimeter (6-10) and close to 50 percent from the floor as they made 22 of 46 attempts.

Finke finished with a game-high 22 points for the Illini along with six rebounds, and Leron Black (Memphis, Tenn.) had 12 points and a team-high 8 rebounds. Kipper Nichols (Cleveland, Ohio) put in 14 points and Aaron Jordan (Plainfield, Ill.) notched 16 to make a total of four Illinois players with 10+ points.

the school's third all-time leading scorer with 1,714 points during his historic hardwood career as an Eagle from 1992-96, earning the nickname "Poetry 'n Moton."

During his junior and senior seasons, Moton was voted All-CIAA First Team, NCAA Division II South Atlantic All-Region First Team and NCAA Division II All-America Honorable Mention. He was named the 1996 CIAA [Central Intercollegiate Athletic Association] Men's Basketball Player of the Year and was inducted into the NCCU Athletic Hall of Fame in 2004.

Among NCCU's all-time career leaders, Moton ranks first in 3-point field goals made (213 of 529), third in scoring (1,714 points), fourth in free throws made (363 of 467), fifth in assists (278), eighth in field goals made (569 of 1,159), 10th in scoring average (16.6 points per game), and 11th in steals (110).

As a junior (1994-95), he topped the CIAA and was No. 16 in NCAA Division II in scoring with an average of 23.5 points per game. His 87 made three-point field goals that year remains the school's single-season record.

As a senior (1995-96), he placed second in the CIAA with 21.3 points per game and ranked among the conference's top 10 statistical leaders in assists, free throw percentage and 3-point field goal percentage.

Moton played on three CIAA Southern Division Championship teams and made two trips to the NCAA playoffs, including an NCAA Division II South Atlantic Regional Championship title in 1993.

After NCCU, Moton played four years of professional basketball in Indonesia (1996-97) and Israel (1998-99). Throughout his professional playing career, Moton averaged 25.0 points per contest, and dished out a little more than five assists per game as a pro.

He was head coach at West Millbrook Middle School for three seasons (2001-04) before taking over the Sanderson boys basketball program in 2004.

Moton is a 1992 graduate of Enloe High School in Raleigh, N.C., where he was named Cap5 Player of the Year as a senior.

In December of 2013, Moton received his Master's degree in Special Education with a focus on Learning Disabilities.

He and his wife, Bridget, married on June 28, 2008. They have two children Brooke and LeVelle Jr.

On March 25, 2009, arguably one of the greatest players in school history was elevated from Assistant Coach to the position of Head Coach, becoming the 17th to be named in that spot in the program's history.

During the 2016-17 season Moton led the Eagles to a 25-9 overall record and a 13-3 MEAC mark, and he joined rare company with John B. McLendon as the only coaches with four 20-win seasons at NCCU. NCCU captured its third MEAC regular-season championship and second MEAC Tournament championship within a four year span to make its second Division-I NCAA Tournament appearance. The Eagles also made history with their first win over an SEC opponent with a wire-to-wire 62-52 win at Missouri. NCCU went on a 13-game win streak during conference play, the second-longest win streak in the Division I era. The Eagles continued to pride itself on defense by being second in the nation in three-point defense, allowing just 29.0 percent of made attempts. NCCU was also top-10 in field goal percentage defense (39.1), top-25 in scoring defense (63.4 points per game) and top-15 in scoring margin (11.7 points per game).

Close to 25 years after the magical run of the 1989 NCAA Division II National Championship team, and just 10 days shy of the fifth anniversary of the day of his official hiring, NCCU soared to its first MEAC Tournament Championship on March 15, 2014 following its 71-62 victory over Morgan State in front of a near-capacity crowd inside the Norfolk Scope Arena. The 2013-14 Eagles tied a school record in wins (28), won the most games in a season for any squad in MEAC history, and was the lowest seed for any league champion in the NCAA Tournament as the maroon and gray earned a 14-seed in the East Region. Moton's squad finished 15-1 in conference play earning the school's first Division I regular season title and won 20 straight contests, which set a new NCAA Division I level record for the program.

The following year, his sixth season as head coach at NCCU, Moton guided the 2014-15 Eagles to a 25-8 overall record, including a 19-3 mark during the final three-and-a-half months, as well as the school's first appearance in the National Invitation Tournament. The 2014-15 squad made history by becoming the first men's basketball team in school history to post an unbeaten regular-season conference record at 16-0 to repeat as MEAC regular-season champions. The Eagles were among the top five defenses in Division I, ranking second in field goal percentage defense (behind Kentucky), fourth in three-point field goal percentage defense and fifth in scoring defense. NCCU completed the campaign by extending the second-longest home win streak in Division I at 35 victories in-a-row (behind Arizona).

Moton joined hall of fame coach John McLendon and national championship coach Michael Bernard as the only coaches in NCCU men's basketball history to lead the Eagles to three straight 20-win seasons. As a credit to the program's recent success, NCCU boasts the best regular-season conference record during the last three seasons at 46-2, a winning percentage of .958.

With the rings of a champion came the accolades as Moton earned MEAC Coach of the Year honors, MEAC Tournament's Most Outstanding Coach award, and was named the BoxtoRow.com HBCU National Coach of the Year, while earning finalist spots in the Hugh Durham National Coach of the Year Award (Top-Mid-Major Coach), and the Top Minority Coach honor, the Ben Jobe National Coach of the Year Award.

The maroon and gray's second season in the MEAC, Moton's fourth, was the coming out party for the program. For the first time at the NCAA Division I level, the Eagles won 20 games finishing the year 22-9, and went 15-1 in conference play to earn the No. 2 seed in the conference tournament. Moton earned national praise by being named a finalist for the Ben Jobe National Coach of the Year Award, and the Hugh Durham National Coach of the Year Award, along with Co-Coach of the Year in the MEAC by CollegeInsider.com.

In his third season in charge of NCCU, Moton took his team to a place not since seen since the 2004-05 season when the Eagles finished with a winning record (17-15) and were seeded fifth in their first MEAC Tournament at the Division I level.

His second year at the helm his squad showed the Eagle Nation how bright the future was as his squad racked up 15 wins and recorded the first non-losing season in nearly six years. He earned NCAA Division I Independent Coach of the Year honors.

He initially returned to his alma mater as assistant men's basketball coach in July 2007.

The Hall-of-Famer joined the NCCU staff after serving as head boys basketball coach at Sanderson High School in his hometown of Raleigh, N.C. During his three-year tenure (2004-07) at Sanderson, Moton led the Spartans to an overall record of 59-25, while winning back-to-back Cap-7 tournament championships in 2006 and 2007.

A 1996 graduate of NCCU with a bachelor's degree in recreation administration, Moton became
